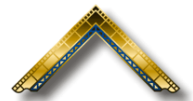
During February we unfortunately had to say farewell - for now - to our dearly departed brother Jack Hoag through a beautiful Masonic

Points of Interest

THE SYMBOLISM OF THE VEILS
By Dennis Dyer

[This article has been adapted from an AMD paper presented by Dennis Dyer in 2010.]

Freemasonry has been often described as a system of morality, veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols. An allegory is a story within a story, as in Milton's Paradise Lost, Gulliver's Travels, and the Hiram Legend. A symbol is a thing that represents or stands for something else, especially when a material object represents an ab-

stract concept. In Masonry we are surrounded by symbols, and yet we rarely seem to try and look beneath the surface for the abstract meaning. We look, but do not SEE the moral lesson intended – let him see who can see, and let him hear who can hear.

Such is the case with the symbolism of the four veils of the Royal Arch Degree. These veils allude to the four principal tribes of Israel, whose emblems were the Lion, the Ox, the Man, and the Eagle. Let us look a little deeper than the obvious meaning seen by the majority of Royal Arch Masons. The same four creatures are present throughout the Bible, Old and New Testaments alike. They appear in "Ezekiel's Vision" and again in the Book of Revelation.

Further symbolism of the four creatures is noted by Edward R. Graham in his book "The History and Symbolism of Royal Arch Masonry". The four signs of the Zodiac are associated with these creatures, the Lion (sign of fire) representing LEO; the Ox (sign of Earth) representing TAURUS; the Man (sign of Air) representing Aquarius; and the Eagle (sign of Water) representing SCORPIO. In addition, biblically it has been said that the four principal Banners have the following associations:

Dan: Blue- Friendship- Eagle- Gospel of John-Passage through the symbolic degrees

Reuben: Purple- Union- Man- Gospel of Matthew-Mix of spirit and emotion

Ephraim: Scarlet- Zeal- Ox- Gospel of Luke-Patience and Self-Control
Judah: White- Purity- Lion- Gospel of Mark-Cleansing from Sin

The signet of the Royal Arch represents TRUTH and its possession indicates one is in search of Divine Truth. The names Jeshua, Zerubabel and Haggai are emblematic of the complete Man, consisting of

Body, Soul and Spirit. Passing the fourth Veil symbolizes that one is entering the Holy of Holies, where abides the perfect Man of divine truth. The four creatures are represented on church portals and apses as surrounding Jesus.

According to Mackey, the Veils present obstacles to the neophyte in his advance to the most Holy place, where he may receive spiritual illumination and be invested with the true Divine Name. Mackey summarizes by saying that passing the Veils represents the laborious, but at last successful, search for TRUTH. Hence, with a little effort we can now "see" or understand that the Veils, which we casually observe as Chapter ornaments, actually hold great significance – if we are prepared spiritually to receive the messages.

To conclude, www.masonicworld.com offers the following about the meaning and purpose of Freemasonry:

Although Freemasonry is in essence a ceremonial method of approach to Truth, the meaning and purpose of its ritual is but little understood by the majority of our brethren. Many brethren treat the Lodge as a mere social club with quaint

little rituals and costumes, rather than a hallowed shrine of wisdom in which the deeper mysteries of nature and of life are unveiled to the earnest seeker. We forget the third grand principle of Freemasonry of search for the truth and the study thereof. ... Freemasonry has been transmitted to us through the operative guilds of the Middle Ages; has a spiritual lineage traced back to the ancient mysteries which are found in the heart of every great religion of the world including Christianity. The goal of the study of the mysteries was deification, where man was led step by step from the ordinary life of the world until finally raised into the conscious connection with the Almighty.

History of Masonry in California: California's First Mason

Before the Grand Lodge of California came into existence in 1850, the first Masons began arriving in the area. While there were many Masons who came to California, first Master Mason to arrive and settle in the area permanently was Brother Abel Sterns.



Nicknamed "Cara de Caballo" ("Horse Face") for his "long-jawed countenance," Brother Sterns was born in Lunenburg, Massachusetts. He was raised to Master Mason, as far as records indicate, in Salem, MA. He moved from Salem to colonial Mexico, where he became a naturalized citizen.

He moved from Mexico first to Monterey, California and began building. His first large-scale building was a three-story flour mill on North Spring Street, completed in 1831. After it's construction, he then settled permanently in the Pueblo de Los Angeles in 1833, where he obtained a concession to build a shipping/storage warehouse in what is now San Pedro. He expanded his business to include the first stagecoach route between San Pedro Bay and the Pueblo de Los Angeles.

In 1841, Brother Sterns married Arcadia Bandini, of the wealthy Bandini family, who owned Rancho Jurupa - what is now the tracts of land known as San Bernardino and Riverside county.

Based on his business acumen, he quickly became one of the the most influential citizens of Los Angeles. Not content with being 'just' a business owner, Brother Abel became one of California's larger land owners, purchasing Rancho Los Alamitos, a 28,000 acre parcel between Los Angeles and the harbor. Due to the misfortunes of drought, he lost 50,000 head of cattle and the land that he'd mortgaged to keep the rancho going in 1864.

Another notable event that preceded the California Gold Rush and involved Abel, was when he was the first person to make a shipment of California Gold to the U.S. Mint in Philadelphia. Shipped in 1842, 1,834 ounces of placer gold was safely deposited in the mint on July 8, 1843.

Between 1848 and 1850, under American military rule, Abel represented Los Angeles. In 1849, he was a delegate to the California Constitutional Convention, again representing Los Angeles. His political career went on to

include the offices of California State Assemblyman, Los Angeles County Supervisor and even Los Angeles City Councilman.

By 1860, Abel Sterns was one of the most important and influential land owners in California, owning Rancho La Habra, Rancho Los Coyotes, Rancho San Juan Cajon de Santa Ana, Rancho Las Bolsas, Rancho La Bolsa Chica, Rancho Jurupa and Rancho Sepulveda (La Sierra). In 1868, he formed a real estate partnership known as the Robinson Trust and put 177,796 acres into the Trust (which included all but one of his Ranchos). By this time, cattle ranches were on the way out in California, and in it's place agriculture was springing up. The Ranchos were divided up into 40-acre parcels for farms and ranches.

By 1870, the lands had all been sold, and Abel was well on his way towards amassing yet another fortune. But before he could realize his fortune, Brother Abel Sterns passed away on August 23, 1871 in the Grand Hotel in San Francisco, California. He was 82. He is interred at the Calvary Cemetery, Los Angeles. Brother Sterns lived a rich and full life as a Mason, worthy of all imitation.

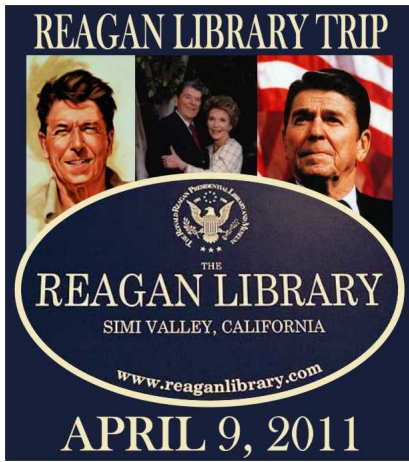

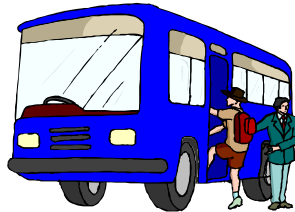
